The Child Development Associate Preschool (CDA) meets these ECE competencies: HSW1,HSW2, IRE1, IRE2, FCR1 and PPD1. \*12 or more points must be ECE specific. The additional 4 points required from general or ECE specific education.

In addition to meeting required competencies through college coursework; up to 6 competencies (total) may be documented through credential approved training for Levels 2-4 and up to 11 competencies (total) may be documented through credential approved training for Levels 5 and 6.





Referral Agencies statewide or 16 modules online and meets these ECE competencies: HGD1, HSW1, IRE1, IRE2, and FCR1.



## **ECPE Program**

- New Program (pending internal and external approvals)
  - Separate from our Traditional On-Campus ECE Program
  - Final 2 years only
- Cohort Model
  - Meeting 1 evening a week (always the same)
- Fully Online Synchronous and Asynchronous
- Two Interchangeable Pathways
  - Licensure (student teaching)
  - Non-Licensure (internship)



## **Program Structure**

## Mix of Online Synchronous and Asynchronous Courses

- Fall and Spring Semesters
  - (2) 8-week online synchronous courses
  - (1) 16-week asynchronous course
- Summer Term
  - (2) 8-week online synchronous courses run concurrently
- Final Semester
  - Student Teaching/Internship & PLC

On-track completion in 2 years + 1 semester (7 total semesters)



## Coursework

- Made Shifts to Traditional Program Coursework
  - Removed foundational courses
  - Embedded content (gen ed) into some courses
  - Created new courses to build upon experience
  - Revised to 8-week online format
  - Added PLCs to 2 field-based courses

  - CI 425 Early Childhood Ed Instructional Planning, Assessment and Learning environment
