

- 1. Go to the ECACE Consortium Knowledgebase at https://tinyurl.com/2ydvdtj6
- 2. Enter your email address in the username field (all lowercase).
- 3. Enter this temporary password in the password field: *Password123!* 
  - \* If you have previously accessed the knowledge base, use the password you created.
- 4. Click Log in.
- 5. Change your temporary password as instructed on screen.
- \* If you have previously accessed the knowledge base, you will not be prompted to change your password.
- 6. After logging in, you will be directed to the knowledge base.





#### **Smart Start Needs and Consortium Goals**




The map on the left shows Consortium institutions. The map on the right shows the school districts identified as "preschool deserts." A desert is an area of the state where there is an insufficient number of publicly funded slots/seats to serve at least 80% of 3and 4-year-old children from low-income families. The darker the orange color, the more seats are needed. Chicago Public Schools, whose funding is distributed differently, is not shown.



## Consortium early childhood programs Fall 2022 enrollment up 18% from Fall 2021 and 22% from Fall 2019. (preliminary data)


