
Two Questions Related to Sustaining Current Work

What can you and your institution do to maintain what's been built through ECACE? Who can help with this?



Course Delivery: Flexible schedules, variety of modalities to accommodate students' needs, Spanish courses,

Holistic Support: Mentors, tutors, advising, "high touch" with students, partnering with other institutions and employers to support student teaching and residency models

Pathways: Individual pathways, CDA, accessible programs, prior learning assessments and helping students to transfer.


Funding: Presidents and provosts need encouragement to allocate funding; seeking external resources and grants, scholarships

Other: Quality, partnerships, demo classroom, etc.





What can the Consortium do collectively to support students and sustain programs?



Funding: Funding options to continue scholarship and holistic support; agency messaging to institutions to sustain funding and mentors.

Network and Learning Community:

Opportunities to learn from other institutions in the Consortium, agency sharing pertinent state information, sharing insights, and learning from each other.

Pathway: Innovative pathways like CPL, apprentices, statewide PLA,

Other: Share curriculum, collaborate with NAEYC for accreditation, simplifying the reporting process

Institutions' Plans to Sustain ECACE Work


- Institutions will provide plans to IBHE and ICCB on how they intend to support the work of the last \sim 3 years.
 - "Academic and holistic support plans to help the enrolled incumbent workforce"
- Plans will include how the institution will:
 - Financial Aid: Help students to determine whether they are eligible for alternative financial supports to cover tuition, fees, and other needed funding.
 - Student Supports: Maintain supports to ensure students can persist and complete.
 - **Program structure and access:** Maintain programs and courses that support increased access and individualized pathways (e.g., program modality, prior learning, etc.)
 - AAS and Other Transfer Pathways: Ensure that AAS Students will continue to be able to transfer according to legislative requirements.

Plans must be submitted and signed by whomever at the institution can ensure these plans are implemented. (e.g., President, Provost, etc.)






More cohesive and streamlined for the state

Illinois' early childhood system is too complex, which leads to inequity and inefficiency.



The transition to a new agency is on a multi-year timeline with three phases.



ISBE, IDHS, and DCFS continue to administer programs and lead continuous quality improvement



Initial Legislation Overview (SB1 and HB5451)

What the initial legislation does...


- ✓ Does propose the establishment of the new Department of Early Childhood on July 1, 2024
- ✓ Does propose to move early childhood programs and services from legacy agencies to the Department of Early Childhood on July 1, 2026
- ✓ Does propose to add the Department of Early Childhood to applicable State advisory councils
- ✓ Does propose the new Department to designate a body by 7/1/26 to advise the Department on an ongoing basis
- ✓ Does propose to add the Department of Early Childhood to applicable Illinois code (e.g., Civil Administrative Code of Illinois, etc.)

What the initial legislation doesn't do...

- Does not propose any policy changes to existing programs or services
- Does not propose any implementation changes to existing program or services (other than to move them to the new agency in 2026)
- Does not make any substantive adjustments to advisory groups or committees (e.g., Early Learning Council, Illinois Interagency Council on Early Intervention)

Phase 2: Transition work begins by centering equity, family and provider voice in both the process and outcomes.

- Starting with parents and providers least centered in the current system
 - to advance racial and regional equity
 - to center families/parents with young children with special needs
- Establish a goal to build a better system for multilingual family services and supports for children receiving special education services
- Create multiple and ongoing opportunities and modalities for parents and providers to engage and help redesign the system
- Engage in qualitative and quantitative data collection, analysis, and use



Early Childhood TransitionTAC Charge


The state has established the **Transition Advisory Committee (TAC)**, comprised of representatives with diverse perspectives from across the state, to serve as an external advisory committee as the state moves toward a single ECE agency.

The TAC will seek and help the state make meaning of stakeholder input in preparation for the transition, with a particular emphasis on understanding families' goals and needs from a comprehensive ECE system for Illinois children.

The Transition Advisory Committee will work with the State's Early Childhood Transition Director, Ann Whalen, to release a report by December 31, 2025.




Consortium Reporting

 - **Challenges**: Time consuming, changing forms/questions, better defining the data elements, technical assistance.


